IS PART OF CONLON'S CULTURE

Just as Conlon Construction is known for bringing construction projects to life, the local company is also known for another piece of their culture - philanthropy.

Tim Conlon, CEO, says giving back to their local community is something their family has always done, and it's become a key part of their business.

"It's a legacy and has been a part of our family culture to be philanthropic," Tim said. "All of the generations of Conlons have been involved in a lot of philanthropic organizations and giving money to a lot of our clients, who happen to be non-profits. We've just always been that way - it's a family thing and a company thing."

Four generations of Conlons have been part of Conlon Construction's legacy, dating back to the very beginning in 1903 when Tim, and his brother, Steve's, grandfather started the company, known then as R.F. Conlon Sons Construction. The company originally began with an emphasis on building schools, churches and hospitals and while the emphasis has grown over the years, the culture of philanthropy has remained the same.

Poppy Conlon, Tim's daughter and the Executive Vice President at Conlon Construction, started to witness her dad being active in the community at a young age.

"It's following a family tradition," Poppy said. "My dad has always been engaged in the community, board work, committees, and volunteering. Ever since I was a little kid, I remember him volunteering. It's always been part of our lives and has come naturally for us."

One of the unique organizations Conlon Construction has channeled their philanthropic efforts toward is UnityPoint Health - Finley Health Foundation, which includes Poppy's appointment as a foundation board member and incoming board chair.

From the first day she got involved with the Finley Health Foundation, she knew it was a special organization.

"When I joined the Finley Health Foundation board, I was immediately struck with how generous and kind everybody in that organization is, from the folks I greet at the front door to the President of Finley Hospital," Poppy said. "Everybody is so incredibly kind, thoughtful, and generous. I am so grateful to be part of it."

With numerous remodels or renovations taking place over the years at Finley Hospital and off-site locations, Conlon Construction has embedded themselves into the work of the hospital and the Finley Health Foundation, alike.

Tim estimates that Conlon Construction has "had our hands in almost every renovation throughout the hospital." While engaging with staff before, during, and after projects, Tim has learned just how special Finley Hospital and its staff are.

"It's rewarding to work with the different staff people, who are very skilled, dedicated, and loyal," Tim said. "Everything they are trying to do is for the benefit of their patients. To work with them and understand where their mindsets are and try to help wherever we can to be sympathetic to that, it's just quite rewarding to work with so many great people."

As part of her work on the Finley Health Foundation board, Poppy has also found it rewarding to interact with hospital staff when trying to identify projects, especially how the project could help staff members provide high-quality health care to patients.

For her, it's made a huge difference when thinking about how the foundation can best serve staff and patients.

"We get to hear from them directly about why it's needed and how it's going to help," Poppy said. "That's so important when we are raising money and being involved in those projects. It makes such a big difference to meet the who and the why."

For Conlon Construction, Tim, Poppy, Steve and Becky, the community is their why, and it's evident through their impactful philanthropic work with organizations, such as education and health care facilities in the Dubuque area.

The Finley Health Foundation and the health care sector is just one avenue the Conlons have found to be a worthwhile cause to financially support.

"The health care industry and providers require investment in infrastructure, talent, and innovation, Tim said. "It's about investing in what makes people in the community thrive, be healthy, and enjoy life."

Without the community, Conlon Construction would not be what it is today - a local company that supports and cares about creating a community that thrives.

"We wouldn't be here without our community supporting us all these years, and we've been here for 120 years," Poppy said. "Without the support of the community and putting their trust and faith in us as a company, we wouldn't be here. It's just natural for us to want to reciprocate that."

Together, Conlon Construction and the community can ensure Dubuque and the surrounding communities keep philanthropy as a driving force for the future.

"When you think small, you do small things," Poppy said. "When you think big, you do big things. As a company, we think big and like to be able to share that with others."

MAKES A MAJOR IMPACT

The health of a community depends upon its ability to work toward common health goals and upon adequate distribution of health resources to all its members. Since 1910, the UnityPoint Health - Dubuque Visiting Nurse Association (VNA) has worked collaboratively with Dubuque's private and public sectors, to reduce the spread of infectious disease, see that infants and children are properly immunized, educate people regarding healthy lifestyles, promote oral health, provide supportive services to elderly in their homes, offer parenting support, and so much more. Since 1997, the VNA has provided Public Health in Clayton County through the Elkader VNA office.

With support from many generous donors in 2023, the VNA was able to provide care to community members through critical access programs, and make equipment purchases to continue providing the best care possible. The VNA saw a significant increase in services to community members from the previous year.

INSPIRE FARBER'S BOARD TENURE



Dustin Farber is beginning his eighth year as a member of UnityPoint Health - Finley Health Foundation's Board of Directors. His time on the board was started by several connections to UnityPoint Health - Finley Hospital and its departments, including UnityPoint Health - Dubuque Visiting Nurse Association (VNA).

Finley Hospital is where Dustin was born and that sparked a lifelong connection to the hospital. Additionally, Finley Hospital is a place where numerous family members, including mom Kelli Naylor, Aunt Kim Barrett, and sister-in-law Stephanie Farber, either worked or trained in direct patient care-related fields.

The real kickstart for Dustin being involved was attending a special event supporting the VNA.

"I went to an outing to support the VNA," Dustin said. "What the VNA does to support the community with different programs and services was the factor that brought me through the philanthropic door."

In the eight years Dustin has served on the Foundation board, he has been alongside numerous capital campaigns and projects supporting Finley Hospital. A top highlight was the completion of the UnityPoint Health Pediatric Therapy Center, a state-of-the-art pediatric therapy center offering physical, occupational, and speech therapy to the youngest patients in the community.

Additionally, he's also enjoyed seeing a unique idea become a reality for area health care students with the launch and implementation of the Senior Student Promise Program. This program offers financial assistance for college students who are pursuing careers in high-demand health care fields, including nursing, respiratory therapy and laboratory technicians.

Dustin believes that identifying and executing a project, like the Senior Student Promise Program, is a testament to the Foundation's ability to do what's best for Finley Hospital and the greater community.

As CEO of Naylor Bag and Supply, Dustin feels making an impact locally is meaningful. "As a business leader, you can see the issues that are unique to your area and I think it's important to leave the community better than we found it," stated Dustin.

One of the driving forces behind the success of the Finley Health Foundation is the other board members Dustin gets to work with. He believes it's a special group that is in the right place and truly cares about the work they do.

"The Finley Health Foundation board is a great group of people," Dustin said. "There's so much engagement with the board members that you don't always see. "I look forward to the completion of the cesarean birthing suite project," said Dustin. "It is vital to create an environment that mirrors the high level of care provided to mothers, newborns and their families."

The Finley Health Foundation's Healthy Births and Babies Campaign is currently ongoing with a vision of creating an efficient,

state-of-the-art, calming environment within the C-Section Suite, providing expectant mothers and their support person a sense of ease and comfort, knowing they are receiving the best care possible.

Philanthropy is important to not only Dustin, but also his wife, Annie. Together, they encourage everyone to get involved in the community by finding something you're passionate about.

"It's finding something that's important to you and a non-profit that shares the same values," Dustin said. "After that, it's easy to get involved by donating your time, energy, and resources."

That approach was instilled in him at a young age and is a concept he and Annie intend to pass along to their children, Mikayla, Eli, Bianca, Cece, and Griffin.

"I am thoroughly impressed with the dedication and hard work the board puts in for the betterment of our community," stated Annie. "Dustin and the Foundation have made significant, positive, and measurable impacts on the hospital resources in Dubuque. We are fortunate to have such a committed group of professionals leading efforts for immediate public use, not only for our children, but for future generations as well."

Spiritual Care has never been more at the forefront of health care than it was throughout 2020, 2021 and into 2022, developing into an additional care tool to assist in the healing process. Clinically trained to help navigate the health care experience, chaplains act not only as spiritual counselors, but also as advocates for patients and staff.

Dedicated chaplains influence better decisions about care, improve clinical outcomes, and enhance staff morale. Embracing the model of holistic care for our patients has proven to result in enhanced recovery from illness and surgery and has long been recognized as an important component of palliative care and hospice work.



In 1900, the Finley Hospital School of Nursing conferred pins on its first graduating class of five trained nursing students and since that time, the alumni association has been a vital part of the school's storied history and now it's future legacy.

The **Finley Hospital School of Nursing Alumni Endowment** was established by the Alumni Association in 2023 to provide financial support to area students pursuing a degree in the field of nursing.

Recognizing the critical need of nurses and honoring their chosen profession, the endowment will provide sustainability through scholarships to area students creating a pathway for future nurses. As the demand for health care services increases, the role of nurses has become more vital than ever before. Nursing scholarships not only provide financial support, but also elevate the status of nursing as a profession by recognizing its importance and value in the health care system.

The Finley Health Foundation is committed to providing future generations with the best health care possible and responsible investment to create sustainable financial resources that ensure continued access to excellent care for our community.

Variety - the Children's Charity

In 2023, Variety - the Children's Charity partnered with the Finley Health Foundation to support two important projects within UnityPoint Health - Finley Hospital, an Infant Warming Bed and Rapid Weigh Digital Scale, totaling more than \$30,000.

The Infant Warming Bed is a critical piece of equipment used within the Family Birthing Suites to provide newborns immediate warmth upon delivery by utilizing a comfortable thermal area that maintains the infant's body temperature, providing a standard of care to all newborns.

The Rapid Digital Weigh Scale ensures the Dubuque Visiting Nurse Association can provide patients with an accurate infant weight after breastfeeding to ensure each baby is receiving proper nutrition. The fully automatic baby weigh scale will provide an accurate, automatically locked in weight display that detects motion and still captures weight within seconds.



Sunshine Circle



Since 1889, The Sunshine Circle has been raising funds to support UnityPoint Health - Finley Hospital. This all-volunteer group staffs the Sunshine Circle Gift Shop and organizes fundraising projects and events throughout the year to support important education, programming, services and capital needs that benefit the patients and team members of Finley Hospital.

Their philanthropic giving, from the first gift to the most recent, stems from their passion to support women, babies and children and can be seen throughout Finley Hospital. During the 2023 Gala, the ladies



of The Sunshine Circle pledged \$100,000 to support the Healthy Births and Babies Campaign, a campaign to enhance the facilities within the Family Birthing Suites to match the level of care provided to mothers and babies needing emergent or planned C-sections.

Dubuque Professional Fire Fighters and Three Rivers FS

The Wendt Regional Cancer Center saw the generosity of many philanthropic partners in 2023. The Dubuque Professional Fire Fighters, Local 25 held a t-shirt fundraiser with a portion of the proceeds supporting breast cancer patients at the Wendt Cancer. "Smaller communities keep great doctors, health care, facilities, and equipment local, so we don't have to travel far," Charlie said. "We have quality health care and hopefully the legacy we leave after we are gone will continue to keep the highest quality of health care in our own community."

As members of UnityPoint Health - Finley Health Foundation's Legacy Society, Charlie and Juli are ensuring Finley Hospital has the resources necessary to continue its vision for years to come, impacting future generations of Dubuque residents. "It's the responsibility of the community members to step up," Juli said. "If you want to have good health care services, then you have to be part of it. People have to make those things happen. You get value where you put your money by being part of things you want to maintain in the community."

The Skemps have helped make those things happen by getting involved with the Finley Health Foundation. Charlie has served on both the Finley Hospital and Finley Health Foundation boards.

From Charlie's perspective, he knew he wanted to make a difference for a place that means so much.

"I felt it was time for me to give back to the community - a community that has been very good to me," Charlie said. "I wanted to be part of the community hospital and get involved in something that allows me to give back to the community. The Finley Health Foundation is such a great cause with a great purpose."

Over their tenure of supporting Finley Hospital and the Finley Health Foundation, the Skemps have witnessed various projects and hospital equipment enhancements ensuring the quality health care at Finley Hospital continues.

It's made possible through support from local donors and the Finley Health Foundation keeping all dollars local, too.

"The Finley Health Foundation is in control of the money and gets to decide what to do," Juli said. "It's going to stay local and is not mandated at a higher level. The Foundation manages their money and decides what's most needed in the facility [Finley Hospital]."

Charlie agrees the Finley Health Foundation is a unique philanthropic organization by being thoughtful with projects and spending.

As Senior Wealth Manager of The Skemp Company, Charlie appreciates the work the Foundation does to steward all funds appropriately. "My association with both the hospital and foundation boards is that they are excellent stewards

of any money that has been donated to the hospital," Charlie said "There's no frivolous spending, and they truly are fantastic stewards of every dollar that comes in."

As Juli reflects on her future wishes for the Finley Health Foundation, she hopes they can keep that approach of staying and spending local.

"I know the foundation has great sustainability for the future with how they remain independent and, along with donor wishes, have their own decision-making power," Juli said. "I think that's the uniqueness of the foundation - there's a significant budget there, and they get to decide what to do with it and where the dollars provide the greatest impact."

With a bright future, the Skemps believe the Finley Health Foundation will be viable for many years to come.

And, that all goes back to the simple, meaningful purpose of the organization.

"The goal is simple - help fund the biggest needs of the hospital and ensure that we have state-of-the-art equipment and highest quality of care," Charlie said. "We keep that care right here in our community and not four or more hours away. If someone has cancer or needs surgery, it's important Finley has those capabilities with the best equipment and best staff."



The Family Birthing Suites team within UnityPoint Health - Finley Hospital is dedicated to providing family-centered care to meet the needs of a patient's growing family. With a specialized care team including: family practice physicians, obstetricians, neonatal nurse practitioners, nurses and support staff, the Family Birthing Suites team puts family at the heart of everything they do.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), roughly 32%, or 1 in 3 births, in the United States are delivered by C-Section. In 2023, the Family Birthing Suites delivered 592 babies, including five sets of twins.

Of those births, **166 WERE DELIVERED BY CESAREAN**. This accounts for **28% OF 2023** deliveries. More than 62% of those C-Sections were not scheduled and happened emergently.

ENHANCING THE FACILITIES

The goal of this project is to raise \$1.3 million from community partnerships to fully fund an updated C-Section Suite.

Streamlining the layout, functionality, and equipment of the current C-Section Suite will provide a positive experience for the patient and their support person, while building upon the current practice of not separating mother and child during the recovery period. This will improve the skin-to-skin contact directly after birth which then helps initiate the first breastfeeding and mother-child bonding that are critical in the first hour of life.

Renovating the current space will provide expectant parents a room which provides a calm and aesthetically pleasing environment with up-to-date technology so they can fully experience the birth process.

Construction is slated to begin in Spring 2025.


