Community Benefit Requirements



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What are they?

Federal basis of tax-exemption for not for profit hospitals.

Requires documentation of:

- Free or discounted care to those unable to afford health care.
- Care to low-income individuals utilizing Medicaid and other indigent care programs.
- Services and outreach designed to improve community health and increase access to health care.
 - Includes a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) and Improvement Plan (CHIP) every three years.

Community

- Platform to work collectively to impact community public health and reduce health disparities.
- Economic attractor – Engaged community, easy to navigate, offering quality healthcare at an affordable price.

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- Story telling tool that our UPH Government Relations uses in advocating for continued non-profit status.

- Capacity building through community relations at a lower cost without having to develop on our own.



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Impact

Access to Care

- UnityPoint Certified Application Counselors assisted estimated **7800** individuals in Jones, Linn and surrounding counties to navigate opportunities to enroll in Medicaid or other appropriate insurance options from 2017 to 2019 YTD.
- Increased access through opening an urgent care clinic. Visits 2017 – 2019 YTD: **31,349**
- Expanded gastrointestinal and pulmonology access.
- Created new access for sleep studies.
- Increased availability of psychiatric services for **25** patients by implementing Telepsych in JRMC's emergency department.
- Increased access to nutrition counseling through expansion of telehealth services to Cedar County.

Behavioral Health

- Increased access outpatient therapy by adding a therapist and increasing hours. **899** patients served in 2018.
- Implemented a one-step referral process from the UnityPoint Clinics to Abbe and JRMC behavioral health therapists using a referral in the electronic health record or a one call phone number.
- Met pre-established depression screening targets for the JRMC Family Medicine Clinics.
- Increased awareness of suicide prevention through JRMC Employer Forum focused on Mental Health.

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Health Promotion

Substance Abuse

- Sponsored online prescription safety education for youth.
 - **495** students in the service area completed the curriculum.
 - Monticello had **97** of the 495 students.
 - **7%** self-reported misusing
 - **73%** more students identify signs and symptoms of misuse.
 - **2 of 3 students** more confident to intervene and understand various ways to refuse participating in misuse
 - Participate in Jones County Healthy Youth Coalition
- Smoking Cessation – **280** patients from 2017 – 2019 YTD

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Health Promotion (cont.)

Chronic Disease Prevention and Management

- Providers and care team achieved max performance level on early prevention and management targets for chronic conditions.
 - **70.9%** management of diabetes A1C less than 8%.
 - **90.6%** attention to nephropathy.
 - **83.6%** patient's blood pressure management of 140/90.
- Disease specific, standardized evidence based patient education implemented and interfaced with EPIC.
- **100%** of identified care coordinators in the clinic trained in standardized diabetes education.
- Using predictive reports, care manager outreach to approx. **150** patients with chronic conditions that had a likelihood of hospital admissions within 6 months.

Prevention - Healthy Starts and Living

- Providers and care team achieved well child visit targets at max performance level. **84.7%** of well child visits for 0-15 month and **90.7%** of children 3-6 years achieved.

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Community Input

- Survey to community partners to verify 5 year cycle plan prioritized needs are still the priorities. 2019
- Participate in Jones County Public Health CHNA HIP quarterly workgroup where ongoing activities relative to community needs are discussed and assistance with addressing gaps in addressing the needs are identified. 2019 and ongoing
- Participate in Together! Healthy Linn CHNA HIP Steering Committee and prioritized needs planning workgroups (ongoing).
 - Follows the MAPP process conducted throughout 2018 for identifying and prioritizing needs.
- Reviewed more recent community health data. 2019
 - Note: National and state data has a lag depending on the measure area.
- ❖ Survey recipients and Steering Committee/Workgroups are representative of agencies serving underserved, low-income and minority populations in the community.






Obesity – Iowa ranked 7th highest for adults and 10th for youth 10-17




OBESITY RATE BY AGE (2018)

Rising Needs Not Prioritized But Monitoring

- Workplace and Domestic Violence / Abuse
- Youth Bullying

Rationale for Monitoring:

- Violent and abusive behavior was ranked 2nd in a 2016 Jones County Community Survey of 99 respondents and a current need being addressed by partners in the Jones County CHA CHIP workgroup.
- However, Jones County is below the state and national averages in violence.
- Increase in workplace violence from patients shown to staff documented in daily safety huddles in UnityPoint – Cedar Rapids.
- In the Iowa Youth Survey in 2018, 44% of 6th, 8th and 11th grade survey respondents reported being bullied.
