CANCER CARE

The May 2025 ribbon cutting of the newly expanded Trinity Cancer Center celebrated 10,466 square feet of healing space, built by your generosity.

YOUR GENEROSITY MATTERS

In 2025 Trinity Health Foundation raised **\$2.2 million** from **1,154** generous donors.

The newly expanded Trinity Cancer Center served **7,000** patients for 11,000 infusion treatments and 13,000 radiation treatments.

One of the first in the nation to perform Pulsed Field Ablation for atrial fibrillation, Trinity Heart Center successfully completed nearly **1,000** in 2025.

22,000 Quad Citians received essential behavioral health services at Robert Young Center.

Orthopedic surgery volumes more than **doubled** following an exclusive partnership with ORA, making Trinity a regional destination for orthopedic care.

HEART CARE

Heart disease kills nearly 25% of adults in the Quad Cities. With your help, Trinity Heart Center is committed to reversing this trend with innovative procedures and world-class cardiac rehabilitation performed by gifted and highly-trained doctors and staff.

After a heart event, exercise can feel overwhelming. Every heartbeat feels uncertain. But because of generous donors like you, patients don't face it alone. In 2025, the Cardiac Rehabilitation Team at Trinity Heart Center guided 408 patients through their recovery with encouragement, expertise, and hope.

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CARE

In June 2025, Robert Young Center opened a new Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic program (CCBHC) in Davenport to meet the growing behavioral health needs of the Quad Cities community. The new

location expanded Robert Young Center offerings to include support groups, behavioral health evaluations, therapy, counseling, care coordination, and intensive outpatient programs. Additionally, improved access to timely psychological testing and diagnosis of children and adolescent mental health conditions enables earlier intervention, supporting healthy growth, development, and long-term resilience.

ORTHOPEDIC CARE

In 2025, ORA announced an exclusive partnership with UnityPoint Health - Trinity. From January to November 2025, orthopedic case volumes more than doubled. Donors not only support innovative technology and state-of-the-art equipment, but investments in specialty training, certifications, education, and scholarships ensure a robust workforce of compassionate caregivers make UnityPoint Health - Trinity a destination for orthopedic care.
